

# Moira's Scarf



I designed this scarf for my friend Moira, and used merino/angora yarn that she had had made from fibre from her own rabbits, and then dyed herself. The yarn is absolutely scrumptious, and I wanted the final scarf to look as soft and luxurious as the yarn itself feels.

Since gauge isn't particularly important in this scarf, you can use any sport or dk yarn that tickles your fancy – Moira's yarn comes in at 11 wraps per inch. I used just shy of 300 yards for the scarf, which measures approximately 4 inches wide by 62 inches long.

I used two 3.5 mm (US size 4) straight needles, and a cable needle to get a gauge of 32 sts to 4 inches in ribbing pattern.

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## Instructions

Loosely cast on 32 sts. Work 8 rows in K2,P2 rib.

Pattern rows:

Row 1: (K2, P2) x 4. Slip 8 sts to cable needle and hold in back of work. (K2, P2) x 2, then (K2, P2) x 2 the sts from the cable needle.

Rows 2 through 8: work in K2, P2 rib.

Row 9: Slip first 8 sts to cable needle and hold in front of work. (K2, P2) x 2, then (K2, P2) x 2 the sts from the cable needle. (K2, P2) x 4.

Rows 10 through 24: work in K2, P2 rib.

Repeat these pattern rows until scarf measures desired length, ending with row 17.  
Cast off in rib pattern, and sew in any ends.
